The 2009 U.S. National Report on Roadside Littering singled out the Province of Ontario's symbol (at right) for 'No Littering' as being out of step with the universal design standard. Looking at Ontario's icon, one could be forgiven for thinking it means 'No Open Cans' or 'No Campfire Beans Without A Spoon.' Ontario does not have a targeted prevention strategy for litter and shows little interest in developing a modern, effective program.
