Around the world scenic locales report intense littering and vista spoilage as pent-up people forget about the consequences of leaving litter behind and care only about having a good time. In Brighton and Hove, UK (story below) response measures include: 400 bins along the seafront, patrolling enforcement officers handing out £150 'on the spot' fines, an additional truck and extra staff for litter collections and a recruitment drive for more staff.
