

Large scale partnership developed

A Dorset-based team of researchers from Queen Mary University of London is leading a Preventing Plastic Pollution project with 17 partners and backing from the governments of England and France. The €14m project goes beyond removing plastic from waterways to inventorying all of it and analyzing how best to deter its recurrence. Until 2023 the project will encompass 160 river cleanup events

such as the one held on World Rivers Day (Sept. 26) with groups like the Wareham Wombles, Clean Up Dorset Squad and Poole Harbour Canoe Club.

Mayor trumpets a strategy

Thanks to Mayor Ronnie Williams, litter is getting the attention it deserves in Natchitoches, a Louisiana town of 18,000+. He's rolled out a strategy starting with a litter-free electronic pledge for residents to sign. A new anti-litter task force will be charged with pinpointing areas needing special attention. The town designed a Facebook page and hashtags #KeepNatchitochesClean, #LoveYourCity, #NatchitochesNotNatchitrash, and #LitterIsTrashy for residents to use when posting photos of their cleanup efforts. Also new is a weekly cleanup event undertaken by rotating city departments whose staff pitch in alongside residents to elevate the issue's importance.

Toronto peddles plastic reduction

Posters are part of Toronto's soft-sell campaign for switching away from common plastic items like cutlery. Downloadable here, they guide restaurants and their customers on how to wean off single use plastics. Canada will ban carrier bags and five other items in January.

Delay on Scotland's deposit return system? (10/4) Beverage makers in Scotland say they're not ready for a July launch of a deposit return system, blaming the pandemic. They're pushing for a delay until March 2023. Fans of DRS say that will serve to increase litter.
