#### Regina goes bag-less soon

BE A CORECYCLING HERO!

February 1 will usher in a ban on plastic carrier bags in the western Canadian city of Regina, SK, pop. 260,000. An individual or business that provides a plastic checkout bag can be fined: \$100 for an individual's first offence, \$500 if a business's. Graduating fines top out at \$500 and \$10,000 respectively for third offences. In a survey of 10,000 city residents, 77 percent wanted action on single-use plastics. The city says a ban will save landfill space, reduce litter and protect the environment. An average Canadian uses 200-300 plastic bags per year.

# Halifax's campaign underway

Halifax, Nova Scotia is advertising its desire to have residents handle waste responsibly. A regional push began in November to teach free and easy options to dumping and littering. Ramped-up enforcement led to two dozen investigations and three charges to date. Fines go as high as \$10,000 and offenders can also be forced to clean up the mess, an official said.

Raising a glass and a toast to litter pickers (1/17)

Nothing like a thirst quencher after completing an invigorating litter pick. In Knoxville, TN they'll give you a free pint of beer for the help in the new Pick Up for a Pint program. Tennessee Craft Brewers Guild partnered with Keep Tennessee Beautiful to make it happen.

Guyana turning to cameras, policing (1/17)
President Dr. Irfaan Ali said CCTV and police targeting hot spots will be deployed to curb littering in Guyana's capital of Georgetown. "It's time we start calling people out," he told St. Lucia Times during a massive two-day cleanup to create clean, family-friendly spaces.

Grant expands volunteer involvement (1/19)

A \$59,200 grant from Ontario Trillium Foundation's Resilient Communities Fund allowed litter-focused non-profit A Greener Future to boost its volunteer base dramatically. Using newly acquired software and online organizing tools, participation rose to 5,250 hours in 2021 compared to 303 hours in 2020, enabling the group's operations to continue through the pandemic.
